"Have This Mind In You!" Phil. 2: 5

I do not who it was that said they began their day "with the Bible in one hand and the New York Times in another." It could have been one of America's great industrialists or a president of our ASCENSION country. It is good to know where such people gain their information because it shows up in the LUTHERAN policies they make or the businesses they run. I can confess I, too, pay attention to news, national and CHURCH local, "in one hand and my Bible in another" as well. It helps to know what is going on the world, but more importantly, what God has to say to us in His Word. Because of His Word I seek to pick and 8888 County Rd 64 choose who I listen to as well as to whose written work I read. School: 251-348-7510 Actually, as a Christian (and pastor on top of that!), I am not at liberty to place man's view above God's. Well, I am allowed, but God's Word has captivated me so that I dare not place man's view point above what God has said, especially when it is contradictory. This is because God's Word is His word to mankind so that we may know Him as our Creator: the One who has shaped and fashioned man Inside this Issue and woman in His image; the One who has redeemed us from our sinful, fallen ways; the One who continues to calls us by the Gospel and enlightens us with His gifts for serving one another. Again, we Pastor's Letter 1 are instructed: "Have This Mind In You ... which was in Christ." As we look to the life of our Lord Jesus, we know even from His birth how the devil and the world rebelled (continuously, too!) against 2

this "King of the Jews" and yet, Jesus, submitting to the Father's plan as He took on human flesh, did Sunday Worship 2 not consider "equality with God something to be grasped... but instead made Himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men."

The apostle Paul describes what theologians call the humiliation and exaltation of Jesus as He Word and World 3 obediently submits to death on the cross for our sins and raised from the dead and seated at the right 3 hand of the Father who justifies those who believe. "Have This Mind In You" follower of Christ! In the book of Hebrews, the writer describes the motivation of our Lord when he says, "for the joy set 3 before Him, He endured the cross, despising its shame, and is seated at the right hand of God." 4 Heb 12: 2

4 This helps us to understand what motivated Jesus so that we, as His followers, are motivated and live by the same thing. God, seeing the darkness of men struggling with sin, sent (gave) His one and only Why Lutheran? 4 Son into the world so that whosever believes in Him would not perish but have everlasting life. We **Choir Resumes** 4 know this as John 3:16. By faith in Jesus and what He has done for us, we have everlasting life that begins in the here and now. "Have This Mind In You" is Paul's way of saying we, too, should see our 5 humble estate. We, too, should see we have been fashioned as a servant. We, too, should, with the joy set before us, give of our lives as Jesus did so that others, too, would know Christ as Savior, be saved 5 from their sin, enjoy the fellowship of God and His people, as they await an eternity in heaven as we Men's Breakfast 5 do! This is the mind of Christ for us, in us and through us. 5

Maybe you are asking how this takes place? How does God makes this happen (Phil 2: 13)? As we said last newsletter, worship, bible study and serving build us as God's people as we are kept by His Word. But even more pointedly, Paul leads us to the 4th chapter of Philippians, the 8th verse and tells

us, "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is 6 pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, <u>THINK</u> about these things." This tells us that what we pay attention will either lead us away from Jesus and God's Word, or bring us close to Him and what we know is true according to His Word.

"Have This Mind In You" we are admonished so that with the mind of Christ (the Word of God) we live in peace with God even as we serve where God has placed us. "What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me – practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you." Phil. 4: 9

Parish Nurses Note

Spring is coming and with it comes spring cleaning and National Clean Out Your Medicine Cabinet Day! The perfect time to get rid of expired or unused medication. This includes vitamins, supplements, and topical medications.

After reaching the expiration date, medications might not be effective, but a few (one is the antibiotic tetracycline) may even be toxic.

It's important to dispose of medication properly due to potential harm to the environment. DisposeMyMeds.org has a locator for local pharmacies that take unused or expired medication.

Another option is to crush or pour medication into a resealable bag. Fill the bag with unappealing or unappetizing material like kitty litter, coffee grounds, or dirt. This will discourage persons who may find it from keeping it for use.

Do not flush medications down the toilet. Waste water treatment plants are not equipped to remove pharmaceuticals from waste water and the medication can be harmful to the public and the environment.

It's also a good practice to remove all personal identifying information from the bottle or package, to keep your medical information private.

Still have a mercury thermometer? Mercury is a hazard to the environment and needs to be disposed of as a hazardous material. Baldwin County accepts household hazardous waste from Baldwin County citizens for a small fee, or take advantage of their amnesty day on the first Saturday of March. Locations are Bay Minette Transfer Station: 4291 Nicholasville Rd, Bay Minette, AL and the Magnolia Landfill: 15140 County Rd 49, Summerdale, AL. Why Have a Lutheran School?

With the formation of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, it was a requirement to be a member congregation of the Synod to provide a Christian education for their children. Public schools were not established, and Sunday School was yet to be widespread. It was up to parents to educate their children, and the congregation was expected to play a role. In many cases, the school was the first structure built, and the church came later. Lutheran education keeps scripture at the center and teaches students about the world around them. A Lutheran education helps develop a student's mind, body, and spirit, all admirable past, present, and future goals.

Today enrollment in public schools is declining, according to edweek.org, while parochial and private school enrollment is increasing. Many parents of our students are asking if we will add future grades to our school because they like our program and want their children to continue attending the school where their education experience begins. The Ascension Parochial School Board is looking to the future needs of our students and is working on a plan to grow our school. Therefore, we asked the congregation at the November Voters' meeting and were granted permission to set up an Educational, Multi-use Building Fund for future expansion.

Lutheran schools nurture children daily in the Gospel. Children learn God's Word through Bible Stories, modeling their teacher's faith, and weekly Chapel with Pastor. Our staff exemplifies servant and spiritual leadership by sharing their faith with their students daily. Mrs. Sally, Mrs. Carol, Ms. Felicia, and Miss Grace share a passion for our school ministry and their love of Jesus with the children. It is a beautiful experience to share a day in the classroom, watch the interaction between the children and teachers, and feel the love around you.

Ascension Christian School is committed to sharing Jesus with our students and parents, and our staff is doing an excellent job. Lenten Signals



Why should we observe Lent? This 40-day season of repentance and reflection that begins on Ash Wednesday has three important purposes. Lent helps us STOP, LOOK and LISTEN.

We observe Lent because it tells us to STOP and rest awhile — and to stop sinning. Lent tells us to LOOK inward for an honest self-examination, to look upward to see the cross of Jesus with healing and love, and to look forward to the hope of the Resurrection. And we observe Lent because it tells us to LISTEN — to the voice of God, the words of Christ and the movement of the Holy Spirit.

STOP, LOOK and LISTEN! These commands that are so crucial for travel safety are also important for our journey through Lent. (See page 5 for service times and theme for our consideration.)

The River of Life

The Red River of the North, in the north-central U.S. and central Canada, takes countless twists and turns. A close-up aerial photo or map shows its frequent sideswipes and U-turns. One could cross the river several times without changing direction while hiking or biking along the border between Minnesota and North Dakota. You might wonder at points if it has completely turned back south — which raises another point: While most rivers flow south, the Red River flows north.
