"All this is from God... (who has) given us the ministry of reconciliation..."

2 Corinthians 5:18

Last month we looked at the story of Mary and Martha as Jesus tells Martha that she is distracted by many things, but Mary has chosen what is better. It is very easy to become distracted by all that involves life, family, community, and church. Not necessarily in that order, but often these distractions keep us, as they did Martha (Luke 10:42) from hearing God's Word in worship, Bible Study and other church fellowship settings. In Paul's 2nd letter to the church in Corinth, he describes God's saving work through Jesus as the means by which we, who have been estranged from God by our sin, have been reconciled to God whereby He does not count our sins against us!

This is the Good News for all of mankind, but especially for those of us who believe since by faith in Christ, we are granted the benefits of forgiveness, love, joy and peace, the Holy Spirit, etc. In fact, all the resources of heaven are at our disposal and stand at the ready in service to God's people. As God has given the Church the command and commission to make disciples, He has also equipped the church to do so as we Baptize and teach God's Word for edification (benefit) of God's people individually and collectively. It is God's desire for us, you and me, since we have been reconciled to God through Christ, as we share the Good News of God's forgiveness and grace in Jesus with others, to implore them to be reconciled to God if they are not already (vs 20).

Paul uses the term ambassador and applies it to how we are to relate to others in this ministry of reconciliation. An ambassador speaks to others on behalf of the one (authority) who sent them the message for which they are sent. In the Christians case, the message is *"God doesn't count men's sins against them."* (vs 19) So when we tell someone that God loves them and that Jesus died for their sins we are simply saying that Jesus' death on the cross paid the penalty we deserved for our sin, and God does not count their sin against them. In our catechism under the 2nd article of the Apostle's Creed we explain Jesus' work on the cross this way: *He redeemed me, a lost and condemned person… purchased and won me from all sin, death and the devil…"*.

Pressed

Gethsemane, the name of the place where Jesus prayed before his betrayal, is an Aramaic word for "olive press." During Bible times, olives were pressed three times to remove all the valuable oil. Before being arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus felt the full pressing weight of our sins on his shoulders. Surrounded by olive trees, praying fervently while sweating drops of blood, the perfect Son of God asked his heavenly Father three times to remove the cup of suffering. Instead of removing that trial, God used it to redeem and save humankind. Likewise, God uses our hardships to refine and strengthen our faith. In *The Rock, the Road and the Rabbi*, TV host Kathie Lee Gifford and Messianic Rabbi Jason Sobel speculate that if Peter, along with James and John, hadn't fallen asleep in Gethsemane, he may have had the strength to not deny Jesus later that night. "All of us must be vigilant to watch and pray so that we don't succumb to the temptation to deny the Lord when we go through the olive presses of life and feel like we are being crushed by our situation and circumstances," the authors write. "We must remember that it is the crushing that brings out the true inner value and worth of the olive."

The Word and the World One




Try this chilly new take on a healthy snack.

- 5. Freeze for two more hours. Enjoy!




