### "No greater to love than a friend lay down his life for another." John 1: 13

We are almost through our Easter season of celebrating the resurrection of our Lord Jesus and how His resurrection empowers His people for faithful, fruitful living. What Jesus has done to set us free from the guilt and shame of our sin is to relieve us from the fear of God's judgment and wrath. "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us," says the apostle Paul in Romans 5:8. We have been justified before our holy and almighty God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. "As far as the east is from the west, so far has God removed your sins from you!" Psalm 103: 12. This is Good News indeed!

If you were to read Psalm 103, and I would encourage you to do so as part of your regular devotions, you would see that God made His "ways known to Moses, His deeds to the people of Israel." And it recounts all the things God has done and continues to do through His forgiving love. "The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in love (vs 8); "He does not treat us as our sins deserve... he knows how we are formed, He remembers that we are dust... But from everlasting to everlasting the Lord's love is with those who fear Him, and His righteousness with their children's children – with those who keep His covenant and remember to obey His precepts (vs 17-18)." On and on it goes, this grace of God and favor from above when His face is turned toward you!

That is why at the beginning we are exhorted to "Praise the Lord, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise His holy name. Praise the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits – who forgives all your sins, and heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit, and crowns you with love and compassion, who satisfies your desires with good things so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's." While that is quite a mouthful, there is even more as you dig into His Word you find that there "is no greater love" than the one who would lay down His life for you!

At a track meet, we sat in the stands, cheering for our son. I chuckled as a young sibling of an athlete asked, "Why are they running so slow, Mommy?"

These athletes had been training for years, and many were setting personal best times and even state records. Most spectators would provide little competition for the runners. But the child was comparing how he'd felt while running at the park, sprinting to a soccer game.

Along the track, dozens of teammates and coaches cheered. Each time an athlete passed, she heard strong, pointed encouragement. "You've got this!" "Someone's approaching; time to pick up the pace!" "Great stride — keep going!" The coaches and runners knew what was helpful and understood how hard the athletes were working.

My point: Consider who you allow to speak truth into your life. Do you listen to loved ones who "train" alongside you? Or do you give sideline critics too much space in your thoughts? Heed Proverbs 2:2 (NLT), which advises, "Tune your ears to wisdom, and concentrate on understanding."

Liturgical scholar Balthasar Fischer (1912-2001) shared an "a-ha" realization about the significance of praying with open, outstretched hands, an ancient practice. The opposite gesture, a closed fist, is used to threaten others or even inflict violence. We also grasp things in closed fists, refusing to let go, to share, to hold gently or loosely.

When we pray with open hands, Fischer explained, we're saying before God that we renounce "all highhandedness, all pride in [our] own sufficiency, all violence." We hold up our empty hands to God, saying, "I have nothing that I have not received from you, nothing that you have not placed in my empty hands. Therefore I do not keep a frantic hold on anything you have given me; therefore, too, I desire not to strike and hurt but only to give and to spread happiness and joy."
