One of the opportunities we have in the "slower months of summer' is to prepare and plan for our after-Labor Day activities. Often though, as people are vacationing, or sta-cationing, less attention to spiritual feeding seems to be the order. While we are sending our children to school sooner than Labor Day, still in the church we continue in the old calendar recognizing for most the focused attention to the 'business of church' happens in the fall/winter months. So, the opportunity for planning now includes strategies that seek to accomplish our stated goals of mission and vision and demand our time and attention. At Ascension we have the added blessing of our school and its activities to further the Gospel ministry of making disciples, followers of Jesus to consider as well!

But all our labor and love, our striving and giving of ourselves to these holy endeavors continues to need the strength that God alone through Jesus Christ offers. The Scriptures and our Lutheran confessions concur that the place God does His calling, equipping and commissioning is done through the Church, the body of Christ. It is in the Word and Sacrament ministry that the Lord's forgiveness and peace are multiplied into the lives of, we, His people so that as image bearers of our Lord, His holy work is accomplished. As we often quote in worship and Bible studies, Jesus, based on Peter's confession of Him as the Christ, the Son of the Living God, will build His Church on that very confession "and the gates of hell shall not prevail." (Matthew 16: 18) In other words, we are not in a competition, but rather a spiritual battle for the souls of people and the Gospel of Jesus Christ is the sword we are given by which salvation is imparted to mankind!

It is the Gospel alone by which the victory is won because what man needs first and foremost is reconciliation to God whom by our own sin we have offended. To be able to recognize and agree or confess this is truly a gift from above because without the Holy Spirit and the Gospel, we would not seek God out or desire to know His Son Jesus who is "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." (John 1: 29) As we have said many times as a witness to God's Word, our default position coming into the world is spiritual blindness to the desperate need everyone has for a Savior who reconciles us to the loving creator we have. It is through God's inerrant Word we come to know His love through Jesus Christ who gave His life for our salvation. It is through God's Word we are strengthened in our Holy Spirit derived conviction to its truth above all else. We joyfully say to Jesus and others, "to whom shall we go? You (Jesus) have the words of eternal life." (John 6:68) The devil is a defeated foe, the world and its evil will pass away, and we are strengthened in our faith and service as we look to and pray for the time of our Lord's return.

This is all because of the "certainty" Peter spoke about as an eyewitness of Jesus, His ministry, life, suffering, dying and rising from the dead. All of Scripture points to Jesus, eternal Son of God, who at the right moment in time gave His life into death for our sin. Buried with Him into His death in Baptism, and raised with Him in new life, our hope continues to be found in Him. He is the lover of our soul and the one to whom we point in word, song and deed as we remain in the very Word that sustains us in that calling. "Let the Word of Christ dwell in your richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your heart." (Colossians 3: 16) It cannot be better said than that!


