"Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness." Matt. 3: 15

"It is proper," Jesus says, "to fulfill all righteousness." The 2024 Christmas season was a wonderful wrap up of last year's outpouring of God's blessings. I give much thanks for how our Lord carried Ascension through some changes in our school, brought a few new folks in to be a part of our ministry, and now... A New Year and new opportunities await! Maybe it is an opportunity to take some time to take stock of where we are and what we would like to do. What things might we continue... which might we not? These are all wonderful things to consider together as blood bought Baptized members of God's household. We get the joy of serving in the inspiration God gives us from His Word.

"It is," indeed, "proper," Jesus says for the time is right for fulfilling His righteousness in the age in which we live. Without getting too much into next Sunday's message, every age has given Christians various opportunities for the things we do to fulfill God's plans for disciple being and disciple making. The Great Commission ("Go, make disciples...") continues to mark the time of the church age before Jesus returns. We are the torch bearers of our Savior as we each carry the banner of His mercy and grace so that in our relationships with others the light of Christ shines through. This begins with the relationship we have with our Lord Jesus who has claimed you as His own, and for purposes beyond what many in the church imagine. There is never a time (or age) when your usefulness has been worn out or unwelcome. There is always a place for God's goodness to come forth as we live in obedience to His loving kindness. One of the ways this happens in a church is when a person is trained to what you have been doing in the church. I call it, "working your way out of a job." When you observe the Gospel movement in the book of Acts, we find churches springing up everywhere as the missionary bands move through one nation after another. In due season, elders and other servants of God have been raised up to carry on the work the apostles had begun. Paul was the best at teaching/training the man (or woman) of God for every good work. (2 Timothy 3:16-17) He trained and moved on often using letters written in jail to deal with certain issues that cropped up in the various churches.

I believe this is the 'righteousness that continues to be fulfilled" by God's Gospel inspired people. The fact is followers of Jesus make followers of Jesus like sheep beget sheep. It is called disciple making. Hebrews 5 and 6 speak much about the response (or not) of God's people to the Word as it is taught, believed and put into practice. After all, much of Scripture is only a reminder of what God expects you and me to carry out! And we do so in the righteousness that is ours in Jesus by faith. We didn't earn it nor do we deserve it, but it has been granted us from God's over-flowing love fountain from above! (James 1: 17-18)

May the Lord's Word of mercy, grace and assurance of His forgiveness strengthen your life as a witness to all the goodness God pours forth! 

4. January Stewardship Corner – "Stewardship is the joyous activity of the Christian in service to the Kingdom of God."

We are in a new year and as I have recently heard, whether 2024 was good or bad, the new year provides opportunities for our Lord to 'new things" in the life of His people! Isaiah (43) writes about this when he says of God's new thing He is working, **"I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland."** One of the things I have grown to appreciate in the last year and a half about an inheritance is that I get to oversee and manage the responsibilities that come with it. One of the sad things about an inheritance is that it took someone's death for me to benefit. Another thing that would be sad would be to lose an inheritance by squandering it away, much like the prodigal son in Luke 15. But there is a joy, mixed with a healthy dose of trepidation in now it being my responsibility to manage it according to the will and testament of the one who died. It is the same with the inheritance you and I have gained through our

Lord's suffering and dying. We all enjoy the forgiveness that He has won for us as The Steward of every good gift from above! And having been forgiven, we in turn forgive as Christ forgave, completely and removed from His sight! The other gifts that are fit for living in the abundance of His grace are ours also! What 'new thing' has God called you in support of His ministry here at Ascension? May the blessing of His good gifts inspire *"streams in the wasteland"* in your life today!

5. The Word and the World --In the concordance of the English Standard Lutheran Study Bible the heart is referred to one hundred and twenty-five times from Genesis through Revelation. In Matthew, 15:7-8, Jesus spoke to the scribes and Pharisees: "You hypocrites! Well did Isaiah prophesy of you, when he said: 'This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me;....' In John 4:13-14, Jesus is speaking to the Samaritan woman at the well: "Jesus said to her; Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." Again, on the last day of the Passover Feast, Jesus stood up and told his disciples; "Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said,' Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'" (Probably Isaiah 58:11) Are you thirsty? How many people do you know that are thirsty? The Gospel of salvation through Jesus Christ is the living water God had provided us to share with the thirsty of this world. Don't be like "The Grinch" whose heart was three sizes too small.
